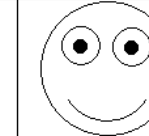
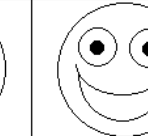

### All about the Open Education Resource Evaluation Matrix

- The Open Education Resource Evaluation Matrix is a tool to help you assess Open Education Resources (OERs) within the context of a specific task i.e. an assignment.
- At the top of the matrix record the task or question for which this OER is to be used. This will help to remind you of the context a) when you assess the OER and b) when you look back at the matrix and consider whether or not to use this OER
- Use each section to assess the value of the information given by the Open Education Resource you are evaluating.
- Tick the most suitable box to show how appropriate and reliable the OER is within the context of your task. 😞 means the OER is neither reliable nor relevant. 😊 means the OER is extremely reliable and relevant.
- Identify the overall rating for the OER by the most frequently used smiley. 😞 means the OER is neither reliable nor relevant. 😊 means the OER is extremely reliable and relevant.
- Make sure you record the reference of the OER and the date accessed at the bottom of the matrix.

### What is an OER?

An **Open Education Resource (OER)** is a freely available resource for that has an open license supporting its use, for example using Creative Commons (CC). OER are available in any format, for example might be a document, information on a website, a video (e.g. on YouTube) or journals (e.g. Open Access Journals).
